

Dr. Merizalde is the current President of the LMHI, having previously served as Vice President, former General Secretary, the Secretary for Public Relations and the Information and Communications Secretary of the LMHI. He is also a past President of the American Institute of Homeopathy, the oldest extant medical association in the United States and a member organization of the LMHI.

He is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry & Human Behavior and the Department of Integrative Medicine and Nutrition Science at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, USA. He is Board Certified in Integrative Holistic Medicine and Psychiatry and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Homeotherapeutics. He is also certified in various models of Integral Human Development and Executive Coaching and has practiced integrative medicine, psychotherapy, and homeopathy for over forty-five years.

Dr. Merizalde teaches undergraduate and graduate students, professionals, and consumer groups. He has taught at Thomas Jefferson University, the University of Pennsylvania, Drexel University College of Medicine, Temple University, the Philadelphia Psychiatric Society, the American Psychiatric Association, the International Homeopathic Medical League, and various consumer organizations. He has published several articles and book chapters on homeopathic medicine in psychiatry, clinical practice, and homeopathic research in peer-reviewed journals.

PAST-PRESIDENT

Dr. Agaoglu, born in Manisa, Turkey in 1974, is a medical doctor and internationally respected homeopath. She graduated from Ege University Faculty of Medicine in 1997 and has been a practicing homeopathic physician for over 20 years. As a founding member of the Classical Homeopathy Association in Izmir, established in 2003, she served as Chair of the Board for many years and remains a key figure in homeopathic education in Turkey.

Dr. Agaoglu is a regular speaker at international and national congresses and is currently serving as a consultant to the Ministry of Health of Türkiye on homeopathy. Since 2014, she has held leadership roles within the LMHI, including Treasurer, General Secretary, Vice President, and President (2022–2025). She now continues her service as Immediate Past President. ### Dr. Jose Matuk Kanan

PAST - PRESIDENT , LMHI (2010 - 2013)

**MEXICO** 

Dr Matuk, you have had a big impact in LMHI governance and have seen the transition from the traditional methods to the age of technology. In the centenary year, we feel honored to interview you for the upcoming spotlight.

### HOW DID YOU ENTER HOMEOPATHY AND HOW WERE YOUR FORMATIVE YEARS?

My medical training was first to study Medicine at the Faculty of Medicine of the National Autonomous University of Mexico where I found at that time the book "Organon of Medicine" by Dr Samuel Hahnemann, a book that to this day I continue to read. This made me find an official school where the speciality in homeopathic medicine was taught, which was my alma mater in homeopathy and is currently the Homeopathy School of Mexico and this school gives homeopathic training with a speciality course lasting three years.

YOU HAVE BEEN A STUDENT OF THE LEGENDARY MEXICAN MASTERS. TELL US SOMETHING ABOUT THEM AND THEIR METHODS?

I can tell you that I was fortunate to have classes with truly transcendent teachers. We can start with Dr David Flores Toledo, who always showed me the most empathetic form of homeopathy. Later, I was fortune to have Dr Proceso Sánchez Ortega as a teacher, who transformed my life, I can tell you that his teachings to date endure in me, showing the path of vital dynamism with the formative principles of Homeopathic Medicine. His simplicity in teaching, his capacity for understanding and always knowing how to perceive in the patient what is necessary, was what motivated me the most. I also had the opportunity and another privilege in my life to be able to study with Dr Jacques Imbrechtes, having the opportunity to live with him in Brussels, where I learned the use of the repertory technique and not only that, but the path always of unicism and orthodox methods. His understanding of each patient, his dedication to patients, the tireless study in seminars, where he showed me how to always continue studying the materia medica, and the homeopathic repertorial technique. They were really the three teachers who marked my life as a Homeopathic doctor for whom I will always be grateful.

As for how my career began, in the LMHI - it was at the beginning as assistant vice president helping at all times the work of the vice president for Mexico. It was then in 1993 that I became secretary of Propaganda and subsequently of Public Relations and then Archives. Eventually, Secretary General, prime vice-president and later President of the LMHI, this ended in 2013.

This long career in the various positions of the LMHI made me understand perfectly that the most important thing was unification. My job was to increase communication by creating the LMHI Website. At that time emails were not common in the organization. It was also important to collect the history of the different congresses of the LMHI. Something very important was missing - to have access to the works of the different congresses of the LMHI that can now be found on the LMHI website, where a digital archive of our congresses was made. The statutes were also translated into Spanish and Portuguese. I also had the idea of forming the Council of Past Presidents to never forget their dedication and contribution to the LMHI. Thinking about the union of all the members of the LMHI is what transcends in this organization.

#### HOW DO YOU SEE LMHI NOW AND IN THE FUTURE?

My current vision of the LMHI is that it has a solid structure and its operation is impeccable. The opportunity to have congresses in different parts of the World has always been a primary objective of the League and also to take care of the Young Doctors who want to be a part of the LMHI. It is important to know that now with the communication developed, the ease of emails and the information that is available, it is necessary to take care of the Image of the LMHI and this will depend on the members.

### TELL US SOMETHING ABOUT YOUR JOURNEY IN CLINICAL PRACTICE AND YOUR METHODOLOGY?

I can tell you that my daily practice of medicine is orthodox clinical, always following the principles of our teaching. I can mention that the integration of the miasms in the homeopathic repertory was another task carried out by us in Mexico where the miasmatic repertory technique is the one that predominates in our prescription. The miasmatic Materia Medica that continues to be developed is also the primary basis of the practice in our office. Acute cases, chronic cases are treated like any clinic and the most important thing is to be sure that our clinic is always orthodox and unicistic.

FINALLY, WHAT IS YOUR MESSAGE FOR YOUNG HOMEOPATHS?

I can tell young homeopaths that they can currently find different methods of approach, for the prescription of the indicated remedy - each path has its virtue, but always keep in mind that whatever method you use - it must be under the principles dictated by Hahnemann's Organon and strengthen our healing method that is Homeopathy.

### **MEET THE NVPs**

#### NVP of Switzerland: Dr. med. Holger Malchow



When it was the time for me at the age of 17/18 years to decide, what to study, I was sure I would never study medicine. But when my father became ill and after a longer time of suffering with no relief for him by the conventional medicine a classical homeopathic doctor could finally help him I changed my mind and decided to study medicine to become a homeopathic doctor.

At that time homeopathy was not taught at the universities in Germany. So I cofounded a students circle to learn homeopathy in my first year of medical studies and I had the big opportunity to learn homeopathy along with the conventional medicine. In the 1990's there was a big interest of German medical students to learn homeopathy. This lead to a national association of homeopathic students (Wilseder supported by the Carstens Foundation, DZVHAE and others. Thanks to generous sponsorship the national students movement had the opportunity to organize seminars in homeopathy with renowned weekly homeopathic teachers. The homeopaths of my father was a student of Dr. Jost Künzli. Thanks to his suggestion we invited Dr. Dario Spinedi, Orselina, Switzerland for the first students seminary in 1994. His clear and very practical method of practicing homeopathy convinced me. Since then I have attended a lot of Dr. Spinedi seminars, travelling also to his supervision seminars once in a month from Germany to Locarno, the southern part of Switzerland.

After finishing my specialization in internal medicine in 2005 I had the opportunity to continue my homeopathic training in the Clinica Dr. Spinedi (former Clinica Santa Croce), Orselina, Switzerland. Now I work 20 years in this clinic, treating mostly cancer patients with classical homeopathy complementary to conventional medicine. The dream of my life came true. Beside of this I am a board member of the SVHA (swiss homeopathic doctors association) coeditor of the german homeopathic medical journal (AHZ Allgemeine homöopathische Zeitung) and I enjoy teaching homeopathy.

### MY EXPERIENCE WITH HOMEOPATHY

-DR. LUCAS FRANCO PACHECO HOMEOPATHIC PHYSICIAN, BRAZIL

Since childhood, I was treated with homeopathy. While my classmates used antibiotics, antipyretics, and anti-inflammatories, I was cared for with homeopathic globules, even during asthma attacks or infections like otitis and tonsillitis. I grew up with this lived experience — not just theoretical knowledge — that it was possible to heal without harming the body. This deeply influenced my professional choice: to become a homeopathic doctor.

But one experience, at the age of eight, profoundly marked my path. It was 1994, the year Formula 1 world champion Ayrton Senna died and Brazil won the World Cup. It was also the year I had scarlet fever. I woke up with a sore throat, high fever, red spots on my body, and intense prostration. At the same time, my cousin presented the same symptoms. We were both diagnosed with the same bacterial infection caused by group A beta-hemolytic streptococcus — and both were prescribed antibiotics by the allopathic pediatrician.

My mother, a dentist and homeopath, had always treated us with homeopathy and trusted deeply in this method. Even under strong family pressure, especially from my grandfather — who insisted she give me the antibiotic — she stood firm. She called our family's homeopathic doctor, Dr. Antônio Alfredo, who prescribed Belladonna. I began taking the globules every six hours, without antipyretics or antibiotics, and allowed the fever to follow its natural course.

Within 24 hours, I began to improve. My energy returned, the fever subsided, my appetite came back, and the rash disappeared — a beautiful homeopathic cure. My cousin, treated with antibiotics, developed kidney complications, was hospitalized, and required six months of medical follow-up. This difference in evolution between us deeply impacted my family. Even my once-skeptical grandfather began to respect my mother's decision and trust in homeopathy.

That cure wasn't a miracle. It was the result of a body free to react. Fever played a central role. Far from being an enemy, fever is the engine of immunity. When allowed to act without interference, it activates defense cells, denatures viral and bacterial proteins, stimulates lymphocyte production, and builds immunological memory. Suppressing fever out of fear, with antipyretics, goes against our biology. Unfortunately, fear still dominates much of modern medical practice. Physicians and parents, however well-intentioned, often follow a mechanistic and reductionist model that treats every symptom as a mistake to be suppressed. Fever, then, is systematically repressed with antipyretics — even though scientific evidence clearly shows it is beneficial.

Children routinely treated with antibiotics, corticosteroids, and antipyretics tend to develop recurrent infections due to a blocked immune system, antibiotic resistance, gut microbiota imbalances, and other harmful effects. A body that is prevented from reacting loses its capacity to adapt and defend itself. Acute illness, when forcibly interrupted, can evolve into chronic imbalance.

This understanding of fever and the body's capacity for self-regulation accompanied me throughout medical school and deepened during my specialization in homeopathy. I was fortunate to study under the brilliant Dr. Pedro Luiz Ozi, who taught me how to connect homeopathy, immunology, and physiology. He emphasized the importance of respecting fever because that's when the foundations of a strong immune response are built.

Dr. Pedro used to say: "Luquinhas, the secret to preventing recurrent infections in children is respecting the fever. A mother who allows her child to have a fever strengthens the immune system and prevents infectious relapses." That made perfect sense to me, as it reflected what I had experienced in my own childhood. Neither I nor my sister — also raised with homeopathy — ever took antibiotics. We rarely got sick. Later in life, I became a father. I had three children: Alice, Letícia, and Francisco. I chose to raise them the same way my mother raised me. None of them has ever taken antibiotics. They never needed them. We treat with homeopathy and respect their fevers. The result? They are healthy, rarely miss school, and have vibrant immune systems. While their classmates often miss classes due to illness, my children remain active and well — as all children should be. Because frequent illness is not normal, even though it has sadly become common.

However, this is not the norm. Unfortunately, generalized use of antipyretics remains widespread. Even well-educated and updated physicians struggle to implement what they know about immunity. There is a cultural febriphobia — a deep-rooted and often irrational fear of fever. The fear of harm caused by fever outweighs the scientific understanding of its benefits. Homeopathy taught me that the body has an incredible capacity for self-healing. And fever confirmed that.

Today, looking back at my journey, I realize that everything started on that day in 1994, when my mother trusted homeopathy, respected my fever, and allowed my body to heal itself — guided by a homeopathic remedy. That decision not only cured my scarlet fever, it healed me from fear, from ignorance, and awakened me to a different kind of medicine — one that sees the whole person, honors natural processes, and strengthens rather than suppresses. I am fully convinced that most doctors practice medicine with the intention of helping as many people as possible. Likewise, I believe parents do everything they can to care for their children. It's reasonable to think that this goodwill translates into rational care, offering the best at every step of the process — and prioritizing therapies like homeopathy that heal without causing harm. But unfortunately, that is not what happens in practice.

Therefore, I urge all of you to help change this alarming reality. Let's elevate patient care culture, adopting a medical practice in which homeopathy is the first choice of treatment — a practice based not on fear but on reason, where the child's immunity and physiology are respected so that we may have healthier children, fewer recurring infections, and a more rational use of available therapeutic resources.
